

Standardised Price List

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this price list for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make clear choices, and let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary)

ATTENDED FUNERAL (funeral director's charges only)	£1,900.00
This is a funeral where friends and family have a ceremony, event or service for a deceased person at the same time as they attend the burial or cremation.	
Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	£810.00
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within a 15 mile radius of the funeral director's premises)	£180.00
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at	£250.00
Providing a suitable coffin - veneered oak with solid oak mouldings	£320.00
Viewing of the deceased person by family and friends in normal office hours by appointment	Included
At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person directly to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director's premises)	£340.00

UNATTENDED FUNERAL	
This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself	
Burial (funeral director's charges only)	£780.00
Cremation (funeral director's charges including the cremation fee and doctors fees, if applicable)	£1,000.00

FEES YOU MUST PAY	
For an Attended or Unattended burial, the burial fee*	£1,065.00
In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is:	
For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.	
For an Attended cremation funeral, the cremation fee**	£833.00

ADDITIONAL FUNERAL DIRECTOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES	
This funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples include:	
Additional mileage (price per mile)	£1.20
Additional transfer of the deceased person's body (e.g. to their home, to a place of worship etc.) (price per transfer)	from £220.00
Collection and delivery of ashes - at a convenient time to the funeral director	Usually no charge
Embalming (This maybe advisable and/or necessary in certain circumstances)	from £100.00
Funeral officiant (e.g. celebrant, minister of religion etc.)	Prices on request
Services supplied outside normal office hours	Prices on request
The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement	

* This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging a new grave, or reopening an existing grave.

** In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctor's fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
